






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HOW WE WORK













ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES (LEAD COMMITTEE)

Chairperson

- Oversees the Public Relations
 arm of the Union
- Provide strong leadership to the RPC by working closely with the Public Relations Executive to achieve public relations objectives of the Union
- Ensuring the successful delivery of global networking programmes and smooth operations of communication channels

Vice-Chairperson

 Assist chairperson in managing the committee and providing direction and guidance to committee members

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Secretary

- Mainly oversees the financial claims and logistical matters pertaining to networking events and public relations efforts
- Manages other important documentation for meetings and events

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ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Global Relations Officer

- Creating and Maintaining global links with international universities
- Organising and executing global networking events

External Relations Officer

- Overseeing communication channels with 80 Non-Constituent Clubs (NCCs) and assist Public Relations Executive in crafting weekly newsletters and other publicity efforts
- Establish contact and improves relations with all student clubs within NTU
